MEMORANDUM OF TELEPHONE CONVERSATION

SUBJECT: Telcon with Boris Yeltsin, President of the Republic of Russia

DATE, TIME September 27, 1991, 12:23 - 12:36pm AND PLACE: Oval Office

The President: Hello, Boris. How are you? (U)

<u>President Yeltsin</u>: I am on vacation and am beginning to feel and look better. (U)

The President: I don't want to interrupt your holiday. I sent you a message yesterday on a proposal I will make on nuclear weapons. I hope you have had a chance to look at it and would encourage your support so that I can mention that when I make the announcement this evening.

I talked to President Gorbachev a little bit ago and I was pleased with his reaction. I just hope you received the message I sent to you. (G)

<u>President Yeltsin</u>: Yes, Mr. President. I read your proposal. If you remember, we had mentioned such an initiative when I was in Washington. And I had also mentioned it to Secretary Baker. I understand this proposal covers a broader range of issues. I would not go into great detail now but I appreciate this proposa. very highly. I think that it shows a new level of trust between our two countries. I also think this is a very positive reactito the changes in Russia and the Soviet Union.

I would like to think that your idea is consistent with the present policy of the Russian Federation. I want to assure yc. that Russia will do everything it can to prompt the USSR to launch a related move to implement this initiative. Also, we have now abolished the Military-Industrial Commission which ha: been in charge of these issues. The new leaders in the Minist:, of Defense are now more civilized and are inclined to agree in general with more cuts in nuclear armaments. They will also listen to what Russia says. I believe the new Minister of

Defense is in favor of such initiatives. I believe the USSR will proceed along these lines. Your initiative is just a beautiful concept. (S)

<u>The President</u>: Thank you. I just wanted to make sure that you had seen my letter. I am pleased you are enthusiastic. I want you to know that other leaders, France, the UK, are also enthusiastic. (U)

<u>President Yeltsin</u>: I was very happy to see your latest message and initiative and am happy for our two countries. I believe your initiative is a serious step to eliminate totally nuclear weapons. I only hope your next initiative is designed to cease completely nuclear underground testing. I told you in Washington that this was of special importance for Russia. (8)

The President: We'll be talking about that. Thank you very much. Now get your well-deserved rest. (U)

<u>President Yeltsin</u>: Thank you. I congratulate you for this beautiful initiative. Thank you. (U)
