

(U) Human intelligence

(S//NF) Human Intelligence (HUMINT) remained an important and growing capability for the agency in 2012. As defined in the Defense HUMINT Enterprise Manual, HUMINT is "intelligence derived from people who may act as both sources and collectors, and where the human is the primary collection instrument." Within the Department of Defense (DOD) HUMINT Enterprise, 15 Defense HUMINT Executors (DHE) — the Defense intelligence Agency (DIA), Combatant Commands and the Services, managed and executed HUMINT operations. For the Air Force, the command and control authority to conduct HUMINT operations (Title 10) fell to the Deputy Chief of Staff for ISR (AF/A2), who granted further authority to the AF ISR Agency Commander, who in turn granted authority to the National Air and Space Intelligence Center (NASIC) commander. Under NASIC, the Global Exploitation Intelligence Group (GX) conducted oversight of the activities of the Global Activities Squadron (GXA) with assigned personnel and detachments around the world.


