



Total fill at tire was 11 hours and 13 minutes and surpassed the previous record of 10 hours and 30 minutes set in April 1971. Fourteen KC-135Q tankers supported this mission. Extensive ferrying operations were required to move the special JP-7 fuel used by the SR-71 from storage areas and Little Rock AFB.3


