MEMORANDUM FOR THE SECRETARY OF DEFENSE

Subject: Exercise IVY LEAGUE 82 (U)

- 1. (C) The Joint Chiefs of Staff will sponsor Exercise IVY LEAGUE 82, to be conducted 1-5 March 1982. The exercise is a selected procedural command post exercise, a type sponsored biennially by the Joint Chiefs of Staff. Exercise IVY LEAGUE 82 is designed to exercise participants and appropriate plans, evaluate WWMCCS, and test procedures during the nuclear preattack and transattack periods. The Government of Canada will also participate in conjunction with its nationwide Command Post Exercise BOLD STEP 82.
- 2. (U) The concept and objectives are provided in the Annex to Appendix A. Preliminary coordination has been initiated with your staff.
- 3. (U) The Department of State and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) should be involved in planning for this exercise. The Joint Chiefs of Staff recommend that memorandums, substantially like those in Appendices A and B, be forwarded to the Secretary of State and the Director, FEMA.
- 4. (U) Without attachments, this memorandum is CONFIDENTIAL.



2 MEMORANDUM FOR THE SECRETARY OF STATE 3 Subject: Exercise IVY LEAGUE 82 (U) 1. (C) The Joint Chiefs of Staff will sponsor Exercise IVY LEAGUE 82, to be conducted 1-5 March 1982. The exercise is 6 a selected procedural command post exercise designed 7 to exercise appropriate plans following simulated worldwide 8 Soviet and Warsaw Pact aggression. The exercise concentrates 9 on the nuclear preattack and transattack environment and LO simulated execution of SIOP and non-SIOP options. The 11 Government of Canada will also participate in conjunction 12 with its nationwide Command Post Exercise BOLD STEP 82. 13 2. (S) Exercise objectives focus on the complex issues 14 associated with command, control, communications, logistics, <u>15</u> and continuity of Government procedures during the nuclear 16 preattack and transattack periods. It is important that 17 close coordination between the Joint Staff, the Office of 18 the Secretary of Defense, the Military Services, the 19 Department of State, and other Federal agencies be established 20 and maintained throughout exercise planning and execution. 21 3. (C) Issues involved in this exercise require a level of 22 participation beyond that normally furnished by the Department 23 of State. Therefore, I solicit your support in providing 24 appropriate personnel to participate in Exercise IVY LEAGUE 82. <u>25</u> 4. (U) For planning purposes, the Annex outlines exercise 26 concepts and objectives. 27



1. (C) The Joint Chiefs of Staff will sponsor Exercise IVY	<u>6</u>
LEAGUE 82 concurrently with the Federal Emergency Management	7
Agency Exercise REX 82 ALPHA, 1-5 March 1982. IVY LEAGUE is	8
a selected procedural command post exercise designed primarily	9
to exercise appropriate nuclear plans and procedures following	10
simulated worldwide Soviet aggression. In order to assure	11
that the continuity of Government objectives of REX 82 ALPHA	12
are met, IVY_LEAGUE will concentrate on the nuclear preattack	13
and transattack environment and the initial phase of the	14
postattack environment.	15
2. (S) IVY LEAGUE and REX 82 ALPHA will focus on complex	16
issues associated with command, control, and communications,	17
and the initial reconstitution and redirection of military	18
forces and civil government. The opportunity to exercise	19
continuity of Government plans and military support of civil	20
defense under this realistic scenario should assist your	21
evaluation of those plans. Our planners will continue to	22
coordinate closely throughout planning and execution.	23

Annex,* which outlines exercise concepts and objectives.	25
