ARMED FORCES CHIEF ISSUES STATEMENT ON KILLING OF STUDENTS

11. (U) MINISTER OF DEFENSE AND CARMED FORCES COMMANDER WIRANTO TOLD A PARLIAMENT COMMISSION ON MAY 15 THAT AFTER A PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATION OF THE KILLING OF STUDENTS IT APPEARED THE STUDENTS HAD BEEN FIRED ON BY SECURITY FORCES WHO WERE USING LIVE AMMUNITION FROM ATOP A PEDESTRIAN OVERPASS. ACCORDING TO WIRANTO, "THE SHOOTINGS WERE CLEARLY PROCEDURAL ERRORS AND A VIOLATION OF DISCIPLINE." HE ADDED, "WITHIN A SHORT TIME, I WILL BE ABLE TO ANNOUNCE TRANSPARENTLY ALL RESULTS OF THE TEAM'S INVESTIGATION, INCLUDING THOSE RESPONSIBLE FOR THIS TRAGEDY." (NOTE: POLCOUNS, ON THE NIGHT OF THE SHOOTING, EXAMINED POSSIBLE FIRING POSITIONS ATOP THE OVERPASS. HE FOUND NO EXPENDED CARTRIDGES. GIVEN THE LOCATIONS WHERE THE STUDENTS FELL ON CAMPUS, THE OVERPASS APPEARED TO BE AN UNLIKELY FIRING POINT. STUDENTS ON CAMPUS WHO HAD BEEN PRESENT DURING THE FIRING SAID CONFIDENTIAL

(U) WHILE WELCOMING GENERAL WIRANTO'S CANDID COMMENTS (PARA 11) REGARDING THE MAY 12 KILLING OF STUDENTS, THE INDONESIAN LEGAL AID FOUNDATION (YLBHI) ON MAY 16 ACCUSED THE ARMED FORCES OF FAILING TO SUPERVISE SECURITY MEASURES USED BY TROOPS TO QUELL PROTESTS. "THE ABRI IS NO LONGER ABLE TO CONTROL TROOPS IN REGARD TO SECURITY MEASURES USED IN THE FIELD," CLAIMED YLBHI. THE NGO URGED THAT ABRI ALSO INVESTIGATE WHAT THE NGO CLAIMED WERE SHOOTINGS OF STUDENTS IN SOLO, JOGJAKARTA AND MALANG.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENTS

13. (U) BANK INDONESIA HAS ORDERED BANKS TO OPEN ON MONDAY, MAY 18, ACCORDING TO THE CENTRAL BANK AND CONFIRMED BY A U.S. BANKER. THE BI REP STATED THAT THE CENTRAL BANK IS PREPARED TO SUPPLY BANKS CASH AS NEEDED. BANKS WILL BE ASKED TO DESIGNATE BRANCHES TO SERVE CUSTOMERS WHOSE OWN BRANCHES HAVE BEEN BURNED. ISSUES TO WATCH ON MONDAY INCLUDE: CASH DEMAND; EXCHANGE RATE PRESSURES; AND POSSIBLE SECURITY PROBLEMS CAUSED INTER ALIA BY PANICKY OR DISGRUNTLED CUSTOMERS. ROY
