Dear Dr. Compton:

At a meeting of the Military Policy Committee on 9 September, it was decided that the exact scope of the heavy water work should be determined after the Montreal meeting; that our effort not exceed the construction of a low-powered heavy water pile for use as a general experimental tool and the setting up of a group of scientists assisted by a small number of engineers to study the general problems and to prepare the way in the event that it should become necessary to carry on rapid development.

While not bearing directly on the report, I feel that you should know that it was also decided that the existing heavy water plant should continue to produce on a 100% production basis.


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
