7. On 6 Narch, to cover the condition in which found himself because of ARTICHOKE, he was told that he had "suddenly been striken with a virus and had become irrational and had a fever of 103°." was again treated and brought "back to health" by 7 Narch 195h.

### ARTICHORE INTERROGATION

- 8. As stated above, was held under ARTICHORE techniques for approximately twelve hours from 2000 hours, h Farch, to 0800 hours, 5 March. #### CONCLUSIONS
