

1. Under a Freedom of Information request, you recently forwarded a copy of United States Air Forces in Europe Chronology of the Cuban Crisis For the <u>Period 6 October Thru 24 November 1962</u> to HQ USAFE/DADF. This document was prepared by the USAFE Office of Information, History Division at the request of AFCHO. I suspect that the History Division did not keep a copy of that specific document because the same information is contained in the monograph, <u>The Cuban Crisis 1962</u>, Impact in the USAFE Area, but in a slightly different format.

2. It appears that the chronology was forwarded to AFCHO in 1962 with different markings than those that subsequently appeared in the monograph. The following paragraphs were marked "classification/Restricted Data" in the monograph. The "RD" annotation did not appear on the same material in the chronology. We recommend that you apply the "RD" marking to the following baragraphs in your copy of the chronology.

a. 27 October, Command and Control section: This paragraph is RD.

b. 27 October, Operational Planning section: The first three paragraphs are RD.

c. 29 October, Combat Forces section: The first paragraph is RD.

d. 14 November, Command and Control section: This paragraph is RD.

CINCUSAFE advised USCINCEUR and CSAF that recent exchanges of messages between the JCS/USCINCEUR/USAF/USAFE, plus information copies of other Unified and Service command messages, contained strong inferences of possible actions under CINCLANT Oplans 312 and 314. CINCUSAFE noted that if United States actions were contemplated which might worsen East-West tension, there were certain preparatory measures that his command could take to improve the readiness posture. USAFE WRM amounting to one-half ton of ARD 863-1 Bomb Ejector Cartridges and 45 tons of LAU-3/A Rocket Launchers was shipped via MATS to the CONUS in response to Inventory Managers direction. CINCUSAFE informed USCINCEUR that the requirement to ship more than 1 million pounds of ammunition and additional ejector cartridges applicable to F-105's had reduced the USAFE war posture.
