

1. A witness who testified who committed perjury was Jeb Magruder.

Specifically, perjured testimony was given by Magruder in the afternoon session of Tuesday, January 23, 1973 as follows:

" Mr. Silbert: ' Do you know anything about any of these activities prior to the arrest at the Watergate on June 17, 1972?'

Answer: ' No Sir ' "

The subject matter under discussion immediately prior to the above question was the bugging and photography operations of the Watergate team. ,

2. Mr. Magruder knows the names of others knowledgable of, and involved, in the Watergate operation sequence. One such person was John Dean of the White House staff. Had Magruder answered truthfully the question propounded above (page 1422 tr.), and made full disclosure of the names of others involved, he would have named Dean.

3. Mr. Magruder was himself knowledgable of, and involved in, the Watergate operation sequence, prior to June 17, 1972.
