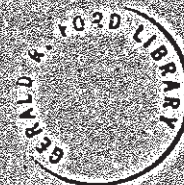

SUBJECT: Investigation of Alleged
Assassination Plans

In view of the Commission's decision to turn over to the White House materials relating to possible plans to assassinate foreign leaders, I think it is appropriate for me to set down in writing what I have on several occasions expressed to you orally.

I will vouch for the accuracy of the facts I have stated in my drafts on the circumstances surrounding the death of Trujillo. In a matter of this importance, I do not feel that you or any other member of the staff who has not reviewed my work should be placed in a position of responsibility for it.

By the same token, I do not wish to appear to be responsible for any drafts you have prepared concerning the results of the investigation you undertook into other cases. I have discussed the matter with other members of the staff, who have not had an opportunity to review our investigation, and they feel similarly.

To accomplish this result, I recommend that all drafts sent to the White House be clearly marked "Draft prepared by _____, not reviewed by the staff or approved by the Commission." I also request that a copy of this memorandum be included in the materials supplied.
