On Wednesday 5th October, 1976 I received certain information about a Cubana Plane which crahsed into the sea off Barbados on the said day (6.10.76).

As a result of the information I received, I went to the Holiday Inn Hotel, Wrightson Road, Port of Spain. I went there with a party of Detectives which included Inspector PRIME and No. 6618 Sergeant CARRINGTON. I spoke with the Reception Clerk who showed me certain documents. On checking through these documents I observed that two (2) men who gave their names as Jose GARCIA and Freddy BREZ of Valencia, Venezuela checked in at the hotel on the said day (6.10.76). I also saw documents showing that two (2) men checked in at the hotel on Wednesday 6th October, 1976. One (1) of them gave his name as Custavo GARCIA of Bogota, Colombia, but the other name was not recorded.

I continued my enquiries which took me to the B.W.I.A. Office, Piarco International Airport, where I received certain information. As a result of the information received, at 1.30 a.m. on 7. 10. 76 I went to the Holiday Inn Hotel, Wrightson Road, Port of Spain.

About 7.30 a.m. the said morning (7.10.76) I saw the two men coming out of room 1105. I stopped at the corridor and I identified myself and other Detectives to them by showing them my Police Identification Card which bears my photograph in uniform. I told them that I had received information that they were involved in the Cubana Plane crash which occurred off Earbades en 6.10.76, and also that they had travelled on board the same plane, got off in Barbades and returned to Trinidad on the enquiries. I cautioned them and they shooked their heads and spoke in Spanish saying, 'No comprendo' (meaning 'I do not understand).

Isearched both men and found a Venezuelan Passport No. 3140805, a small diary, a key with tag marked 'Village Hotel 61' and other documents. These were found on the fairer of the two (2) men, who gave his name as Jose Vasquez GARCIA. On the other man who gave his name as Freddy LUGO, I found a Venezuelan Passport No. 2123051, a small diary and other documents. I then searched Room No. 1105 which the two (2) men occupied but nothing was found.

Port of Spain, Trinidad. I summoned No. 6823 Corporal KING, the Police Spanish Interpreter to my office. Through Corporal KING, the I again identified myself to both men and told them that they for E Lord were wanted for enquiries in connection with a Cubana Plane which crashed in the sea off Barbadoz on 6.10.76. Through Corporal KING I told them that I believed that they could assist in the investigations. They spoke in Spanish and through Corporal KING, I learnt that they

said that they knew nothing about the plane crash. I instructed Corporal KING to ask them for their luggage and Ricardo LOZANO (Jose Vasquex GARCIA) said he and his friend Freddy LUGO were robbed of their luggage in Barbados. Through Corporal KING they were asked if they reported the matter to the Police, or anyone, and they replied that the people in Barbados did not understand Spanish and they did people in Barbados did not understand Spanish, and they did not understand English.
