Autodefensas (Magdalena) About 1 to $1\frac{1}{2}$ years ago the (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) approached (b)(6),(about Convivir contacted (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) Autodefensas armed operation in (b)(6),(b)(7)(C)small town near Santa Marta. (b)(6),(b)((D)(6),(D)(7)(C) (b)(6),(b)(7)(C)(b)(6),(b)(7)(C)the only people at the hotel were Autodefensas soldiers. He said the leader "had the coldest eyes he had ever seen." During a very short meeting, the leader bluntly and as matter of fact (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) Autodefensas had arrived in Magdalena and had started operations and that it was time for Banadex to start making payments to Autodefensas. He did not threater (b)(6),(b)(heither did he indicate any willingness to discuss the issue. The leader's unspoken but clear message was "we are here in Santa Marta and we are strong (e.g. all the soldiers at the hotel), we know who you are, and you need to make sure Banadex pays when we ask."
