ABOUT TEN BUSES (SOME WITH PROFESSORS VISIBLE IN FRONT) WERE ALLOWED TO ENTER THE COMPLEX, AND SOME STUDENTS WERE ALLOWED TO ENTER ON FOOT. AFTER THE BUSES ENTERED, THE GATE WAS SHUT AND THE STUDENTS STILL ARRIVQTHE GATES. POLOFFS SAW STUDENTS FROM BETWEEN TEN AND TWENTY UNIVERSITIES THERE, MANY WEARING THEIR UNIVERSITY JACKETS. ALSO PRESENT WERE AMIEN RAIS, UI ALUMNI AND REPRESENTATIVES OF SEVERAL MASS STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS, AND A GROUP OF 15 RETIRED GENERALS FROM THE GENERATION OF 1945. THERE WAS A LARGE PRESS PRESENCE. THERE WERE ABOUT 1000 STUDENTS INSIDE THE COMPLEX. THE STUDENT REPRESENTATIVES WERE MET BY HARRY SABARNO OF THE ABRI FRACTION, WHO RECEIVED THEIR STATEMENT DEMANDING SOEHARTO IMMEDIATELY STEP DOWN AND

(C) THE PARLIAMENTARIAN TOLD POLOFFS THAT MOST OF THE MEMBERS AT THE COMMITTEE MEETING AGREED WITH RAIS'S BASIC POINT, BUT BELIEVED THAT TIME WAS NECESSARY IN ORDER TO CREATE INSTITUTIONS AND RULES TO INSURE A SMOOTH TRANSITION. 16. (U) MEDAN: STUDENTS IN MEDAN HELD A DEMONSTRATION OF ABOUT 500 PEOPLE AT THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH SUMATRA. AS OF 1530, THEY WERE BEGINNING TO BURN TIRES IN THE ROAD OUTSIDE THE GATE. WE WILL CONTINUE TO TRACK FOOD AVAILABILITY AND PRICES. WE DO NOT KNOW IF TODAY'S HEAVY SHOPPING WAS PANIC BUYING. IF IT WAS OR IF IT BEGINS, THE VOLUMES WILL OVERWHELM NORMAL DISTRIBUTION CHANNELS AND SHORTAGES AND PRICE GOUGING WILL SURELY EMERGE. MORE BASICALLY, WE ARE TRYING TO ASCERTAIN IF DISTRIBUTION SYSTEMS ARE FUNCTIONING NORMALLY ENOUGH TO GET BASIC COMMODITIES TO THE RETAIL LEVEL.

21. (U) ATM'S: THERE WERE LONG LINES AT ATM MACHINES. MILITARY PERSONNEL WERE OBSERVED ENSURING THAT PEOPLE STAYED IN ORDERLY LINES AND MAINTAINING ORDER WHEN THE CASH IN THE MACHINE RAN OUT.

22. (U) BANKS: BANKS REPORTED HEAVY CASH WITHDRAWALS STARTING AT OOB. CUSTOMERS WERE WITHDRAWING BOTH DOLLARS AND RUPIAH. ONE U.S. BANK REPORTED THAT BANK INDONESIA HAD PLACED A USD 100,000 DAILY LIMIT ON THE AMOUNT OF CASH DOLLARS A BANK COULD BUY FROM THE CENTRAL BANK. ANOTHER CONFIRMED THAT DOLLARS WERE IN SHORT SUPPLY. BANKS REPORTED THAT BANK INDONESIA HAD BEEN SLOW PROVIDING CASH RUPIAH. BANK DANAMON REPORTED THAT CUSTOMER

23. (U) FUEL SUPPLIES: STATE-OWNED OIL COMPANY PERTAMINA TOLD US TODAY THAT FUEL SUPPLIES IN REFINERIES AND IN PERTAMINA DEPOTS AROUND THE COUNTRY WERE ADEQUATE FOR A MONTH. PREMIUM GASOLINE AND KEROSENE SUPPLIES ARE SUFFICIENT FOR 35 DAYS, PERTAMINA SAID. PERTAMINA CONFIRMED NEWSPAPER REPORTS THAT IT PLANS TO IMPORT MORE PRODUCT, INCLUDING HIGH OCTANE MOTOR GASOLINE COMPONENT (THIS PRODUCT'S IMPORT REQUIRED BECAUSE OF CONTINUING PROBLEMS WITH THE BALONGAN REFINERY).

24. (U) BUSINESS: MANY BUSINESSES REOPENED ON MONDAY. HOWEVER, BY EARLY AFTERNOON, WE HAD RECEIVED SEVERAL REPORTS THAT EMPLOYEES HAD BEEN SENT HOME. GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES WERE LEAVING THEIR OFFICES EARLY AS WELL AS INDIVIDUALS' SECURITY CONCERNS MOUNTED. MANY FIRMS ARE CONSIDERING CLOSING ON WEDNESDAY, MAY 20.
