

Briefing of CIA Subcommittee of House Armed Services Committee

9:30 - 9 November 1967

Specific items requested were:

- a. Moscow Parade
- b. FOBS
- c. New Soviet Submarines

- a. Runge case including Soviet denial
 - b. Evert Clark article - New York Times of 17 October - item headed "Soviets cannot orbit shots"
 - c. George Wilson article in the Post of 8 November to the effect that "Peking may produce satellite before ICBM"
 - d. Periscope item of 5 June referring to a junior member of the Hungarian embassy staff in Washington defecting three weeks before Janos Radvanyi
 - e. Post article of 11 June 1967 relating to warnings from UN officials that Russia may put medium range missiles in Vietnam
 - f. Story that Russians are now building their first aircraft carrier
 - g. New York Times article, dateline Bonn, 9 October, that "Spying is at peak in West Germany"
 - h. Philby case
 - i. Unidentified news item that ChiNats have been able to plant scores of undercover agents on the Mainland
 - j. Newsweek item of 2 October that German Rocket Expert, Wolfgang Pilz, has been in Red China helping on missiles
 - k. Newspaper item from London to the effect that a system of coding and decoding secret documents using only a piece of glass has been developed by British scientists
 - l. News item questioning "Did the KGB murder Charles Jordan in Czechoslovakia?"
 - m. New York Times of 13 August headlined "2 reports laud French progress on nuclear progress"
 - n. Harwood article headlined "CIA assumes a big Vietnam role, now financier for social reform"
 - o. Newspaper article dealing with U. S. denunciation of the conviction of Peter Feinauer on spying charges by East German court
