SUBJECT: Control Mechanisms for IRBM's in Turkey

In your absence Secretary McNamara (Tab B) responded to your letter of July 22 (Tab C) expressing your concern that a program be formulated to ensure that the Turks could not make effective use of IRBM's without our cooperation during the life of the weapons. Mr. McNamara cited the conclusion of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and of his Assistant Secretary for Atomic Energy that the best feasible methods of control were being implemented, and reported that a committee had been created to study how these methods could be improved as technical advance is accomplished.

There is attached a draft acknowledgment for your signature expressing your gratification at the information imparted by Mr. McNamara, and your hope to be informed from time to time as further progress is made (Tab A).


