BIOGRAPHY

I was born in July 1927 in Eupatoria (Crimea). When I was 4 years old my parents came from Crimea to Moscow, and from that time to February 22 1977 I lived in Moscow.

→ I ended the historian department of the Moscow' University in 1950. For three years I was a teacher. In that time (1952) I became the member of the Communist Party of the USSR. In 1953 I go to the post graduate (the department of the Party' history in the Moscow' economical statistical institute) and ended it in 1956.

From 1959 I was an editor in the historical department of the publish-house "Nauka". In 1968 I was excluded from the Party and lost my job, because I had signed the letter to defende Yury Galanskov and Alexandr Ginzburg. For three years then I have no job. From 1971 to 1976 I was an editor in Institute of Information of Academia of Science of the USSR.

Exceptionally fortunate?

③ In February 1977 I left the USSR as an emigrant. Now I live in the USA in campus of the college Bethany, where my husband Nikolai Williams has his position.

I was one of 10 members, who founded the Moscow' Group to Promote Observance of the Helsinki Agreements in the USSR, and now I represent this Group abroad.
