To update you on the status of our review of the project ,I must be candid in stating that we remain concerned about the potential ecological and social impacts caused by the gas exploitation and associated facilities in the environmentally sensitive areas of Block 88 and the Urubamba River. The degree of our concern is unusual, yet warranted to the extent that serious questions remain regarding the Project's ability to adequately mitigate the impacts so as to satisfy the environmental objectives contained in EX-IM Bank's Environmental Guidelines. our review of the project continues to progress and we will inform you of subsequent requirements or further developments.
